INTRODUCTION

And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us... (John 1:14)

This week, we are invited to realize within our humanity how Jesus wanted so much to dwell in our nothingness. What is in us? What we have is humanity that Jesus likes so much to stay.

(Psalm 8:3-4) When I look at the sky, which you have made and the stars, which you set in their places, what are human beings, that you think of them, mere mortals, that you care for them? Yet you made them inferior only to yourself; you crown them with glory and honor.

It is about time for us to recognize, who Jesus really is in our life, in the real essence of a deep understanding. How come He needs to become this new born baby, lived with us and died among us?
