TUESDAY I am Verbum Dei: called to manifest

"God with us"

⁷ My dear friends, let us love one another, since love is from God and everyone who loves is a child of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever fails to love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ This is the revelation of God's love for us, that God sent his only Son into the world that we might have life through him. ¹⁰ Love consists in this: it is not we who loved God, but God loved us and sent his Son to expiate our sins. **(1 John 4:7-10)**

³⁵ What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? ³⁶ As it is written:
"For your sake we are being slain all the day; we are looked upon as sheep to be slaughtered." ³⁷ No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

(Romans 8:35-39)

¹¹ My dear friends, if God loved us so much, we too should love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God, but as long as we love one another God remains in us and his love comes to its perfection in us. ¹³ This is the proof that we remain in him and he in us, that he has given us a share in his Spirit. ¹⁴ We ourselves have seen and testify that the Father sent his Son as Saviour of the world. ¹⁵ Anyone who acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God remains in him and he in God.

¹⁶ We have recognised for ourselves, and put our faith in, the love God has for us. God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him. ¹⁷ Love comes to its perfection in us when we can face the Day of Judgement fearlessly, because even in this world we have become as he is. ¹⁸ In love there is no room for fear, but perfect love drives out fear, because fear implies punishment and no one who is afraid has come to perfection in love. **(1 John 4:11-18)**

It is true that we have been walking in darkness. We have had many experiences of darkness in life. But we are people who have seen a great light. Like the Magi we continue to journey together towards this great light, not stopping until we encounter Him and make him as our light.

THURSDAY

I am Verbum Dei: united in His same universal love

The Verbum Dei Missionary Family is an Institution in the Catholic Church at the service of the Word of God in which belong all the faithful that share the same spirituality and mission of Verbum Dei... *(FAMVD Statutes 1.2.2)*

The identity of the FAMVD is expressed in her name: to be "family", profoundly "missionary", at the service of announcing the "Word of God". The FAMVD reunites in her womb persons or groups from all states of life, sex, culture and social condition, that participates in one same vocation to be "Verbum Dei"... (FAMVD Statutes 1.2.3)

Its finality is the living out and the propagation of the Kingdom of God through prayer, testimony of life and the ministry of the Word, forming apostles of Christ and generating evangelizing communities... *(FAMVD Statutes 1.2.4)*

⁴² When daylight came he left the house and made his way to a lonely place. The crowds went to look for him, and when they had caught up with him they wanted to prevent him leaving them, ⁴³ but he answered, 'I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns too, because that is what I was sent to do.' *(Luke 4:42-43)*

The invitation today is to be one in the universal love of Christ who desires so much to reach out and welcome everyone in the Fathers embrace. ³⁹ When they had done everything the Law of the Lord required, they went back to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth.
 ⁴⁰ And as the child grew to maturity, he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him. (Luke 2:39-40)

⁵¹ He went down with them then and came to Nazareth and lived under their authority. His mother stored up all these things in her heart. ⁵² And Jesus increased in wisdom, in stature, and in favour with God and with people. (Luke 2:51-52)

⁷ During his life on earth, he offered up prayer and entreaty, with loud cries and with tears, to the one who had the power to save him from death, and, winning a hearing by his reverence, ⁸ he learnt obedience, Son though he was, through his sufferings; ⁹ when he had been perfected, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal salvation

²² After this, Jesus went with his disciples into the Judaean countryside and staved with them there and baptised. ²³ John also was baptising at Aenon near Salim, where there was plenty of water, and people were going there and were being baptised. ²⁴ For John had not yet been put in prison.²⁵ Now a discussion arose between some of John's disciples and a Jew about purification, ²⁶ so they went to John and said, 'Rabbi, the man who was with you on the far side of the Jordan, the man to whom you bore witness, is baptising now, and everyone is going to him.'²⁷ John replied: 'No one can have anything except what is given him from heaven.²⁸ 'You yourselves can bear me out. I said, "I am not the Christ; I am the one who has been sent to go in front of him."²⁹ 'It is the bridegroom who has the bride; and yet the bridegroom's friend, who stands there and listens to him, is filled with joy at the bridegroom's voice. This is the joy I feel, and it is complete. ³⁰ He must grow greater, I must grow less. (John 3:22-30)

As we end the Christmas season, we continue to encounter and manifest Jesus as the source of our joy, our motivation in giving ourselves daily. We as a Family must continue to make him known in the world of today by letting Him grow greater each day and forever.
