INTRODUCTION

The lay missionaries/disciples of the VDMFa are guided by the present statute and desire to live their baptismal consecration in plenitude through the Verbum Dei spirit and mission. It is a call of God in a vocation that is fully missionary and lay¹, inserted in society. Those who participate in through this reality include youth and adults, singles, married, or persons in other situations of life. (VDMFa Statutes #16)

Last week, we were praying particularly on the different realities of our brothers and sisters in the world. The question comes, 'How can we as a Verbum Dei Family respond to these realities?' MONDAY

<u>To be a people. To be part of a</u> people

1 Peter 2:9-10 ⁹ But you are a chosen race, a kingdom of priests, a holy nation, a people to be a personal possession to sing the praises of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light. ¹⁰ Once you were a non-people and now you are the People of God; once you were outside his pity; now you have received pity.

Jesus wants us to touch human misery, to touch the suffering flesh of others. He hopes that we will stop looking for those personal or communal niches which shelter us from the maelstrom of human misfortune and instead enter into the reality of other people's lives and know the power of tenderness. Whenever we do so, our lives become wonderfully complicated and we experience intensely what is to be a people, to be part of a people.

TUESDAY

<u>A Family building the Kingdom of</u> God in the world

Hebrews 10:22-25 ²² So as we go in, let us be sincere in heart and filled with faith, our hearts sprinkled and free from any trace of bad conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us keep firm in the hope we profess, because the one who made the promise is trustworthy. ²⁴ Let us be concerned for each other, to stir a response in love and good works. ²⁵ Do not absent yourself from your own assemblies, as some do, but encourage each other; the more so as you see the Day drawing near.

Isaiah 11:6-9 ⁶ The wolf will live with the lamb, the panther lie down with the kid, calf, lion and fat-stock beast together, with a little boy to lead them. ⁷ The cow and the bear will graze, their young will lie down together. The lion will eat hay like the ox. ⁸ The infant will play over the den of the adder; the baby will put his hand into the viper's lair. ⁹ No hurt, no harm will

be done on all my holy mountain, for the country will be full of knowledge of Yahweh as the waters cover the sea.

What are we trying to do in the world of today? We are trying to build in the Verbum Dei Family, making real the Kingdom of God here on earth and in this generation through our charism and mission. Let us collaborate with God in doing this.

WEDNESDAY

<u>Growing in the light and knowledge</u> <u>of God</u>

THURSDAY

Do not live as closed cells

Our communitarian life should always be in function of the greatest apostolic effectiveness and favours it to the maximum. Our aspiration will be to untiringly form living cells and new dynamic communities that share the eternal life in praise of the Father with everyone.

Mark 1:35-39 ³⁵ In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. ³⁶ Simon and his companions set out in search of him, ³⁷ and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' ³⁸ He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can proclaim the message there too, because that is why I came.' ³⁹ And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out devils.

FRIDAY

(Solemnity of the Birth of John the Baptist)

Matthew 7:24-27 ²⁴ 'Therefore, everyone who listens to these words of mine and acts on them will be like a sensible man who built his house on rock. ²⁵ Rain came down, floods rose, gales blew and hurled themselves against that house, and it did not fall: it was founded on rock. ²⁶ But everyone who listens to these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a stupid man who built his house on sand. ²⁷ Rain came down, floods rose, gales blew and struck that house, and it fell; and what a fall it had!'

Mark 3:33-35 ³³ He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' ³⁴ And looking at those sitting in a circle round him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. ³⁵ Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'

Let us help build the different realities become apostles rooted in the Word of God because the Word of God is the solid foundation for our mission. Wherever we are sent, whatever we do, we will not be easily shaken because we are standing on solid rock.

SATURDAY
