

MONDAY

Encounter Jesus all the more (Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary)

Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah. where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." (Continue reading.....)

"33 So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them.

Luke 24:30-33

50 Then he led them [out] as far as Bethany, raised his hands, and blessed them.51As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven.52They did him homage and then returned to Jerusalem with great joy, 53 and they were continually in the temple praising God.

Luke 24:50-53


