**Personal Reflection of the day:**

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**They welcomed the message of faith**

<sup>4</sup>Once they had scattered, they went from place to place preaching the good news. <sup>5</sup>And Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. <sup>6</sup>The people unanimously welcomed the message Philip preached, because they had heard of the miracles he worked and because they saw them for themselves. <sup>7</sup>For unclean spirits came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. <sup>8</sup>As a result there was great rejoicing in that town. **(Acts 8:4-8)**

In all the baptized, from first to last, the sanctifying power of the Spirit is at work, impelling us to evangelization. The people of God is holy thanks to this anointing, which makes it infallible in credendo. This means that it does not err in faith, even though it may not find words to explain that faith. The Spirit guides it in truth and leads it to salvation. As part of his mysterious love for humanity, God furnishes the totality of the faithful with an instinct of faith – sensus fidei – which helps them to discern what is truly of God. The presence of the Spirit gives Christians a certain connaturality with divine realities, and a wisdom which enables them to grasp those realities intuitively, even when they lack the wherewithal to give them precise expression. **(Evangelii Gaudium 119)**

**Personal Reflection of the day:**

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**God calls us to salvation through the Church**

The salvation which God has wrought, and the Church joyfully proclaims, is for everyone. God has found a way to unite himself to every human being in every age. He has chosen to call them together as a people and not as isolated individuals. No one is saved by himself or herself, individually, or by his or her own efforts. God attracts us by taking into account the complex interweaving of personal relationships entailed in the life of a human community. This people which God has chosen and called is the Church. Jesus did not tell the apostles to form an exclusive and elite group. He said: “Go and make disciples of all nations” (Mt28:19). Saint Paul tells us in the people of God, in the Church, “there is neither Jew or Greek... for you are all one in Christ Jesus” (Gal3:28). To those who feel far from God and the Church, to all those who are fearful or indifferent, I would like to say this: the Lord, with great respect and love, is also calling you to be a part of his people!
